CLASSICS FOR ALL Championing Classics in Schools

We are very excited to announce that Key Stage 2 pupils will soon be given the opportunity to learn Latin at HMS. Thanks to the generous support of the PTA, the Primary Latin Project, Classics for All and Mrs Jarvis, a parent and Latin trainer, we will soon be offering a lunchtime club to pupils in Years 5 and 6 who wish to experience ancient Roman culture and take their first steps in learning Latin. We will be following the Minimus scheme, which is a fantastic book studied in schools worldwide and set at nearby Vindolanda. We would be pleased to hear from any members of our school community who may be able to support this new venture either through knowledge of Latin or archaeology.

Water Safety Week - Year 8

Northumberland Fire and Rescue visited HMS to provide information, guidance and advice to pupils on how to stay safe near water. The crew attending the school brought with them a range of water rescue equipment, explaining the dangers of open water. Demonstrations were provided to year 8 pupils on the use of rescue equipment along with the personal protective equipment needed to keep fire and rescue officers safe. These included students attempting the launch of throw bags at targets to simulate an aspect of a live water rescue. Thank you to Northumberland Fire and Rescue for offering their time to come to speak to our year 8 pupils; living next a major river in our part of the country, we have to appreciate the power of water and how to respect it. One pupil said "I think after seeing this today I want to be a fire fighter and save lives!"

Newcastle University visit HMS
