Parents/ carers must access the portal to make applications for places in local middle, high and secondary schools. For Year 8 moving on to high school, please make sure you apply before the deadline as no pupil is guaranteed a place. Public Health England have produced a letter for schools to distribute to parents which explains when a person requires a coronavirus test and what the symptoms of coronavirus are. Forest School helps to develop confidence and self-esteem through learner-inspired, hands-on experiences in a natural setting. Forest School Club has started on a Friday after school 3.30pm - 4.30pm for year 6 pupils. Last week, it was lovely to see the pupils exploring the forest area and learning the forest rules. We are really looking forward to having a fire and toasting marshmallows this coming Friday. Mrs Gray and the pupils are aware of being safe at all times during Forest School and have even made a tippy tap for washing hands. There are still

Class Charts

We are delighted that **over 75%** of parents/ carers are now accessing Class Charts. We would really appreciate you downloading the app and regularly <u>accessing the site</u> so that we can keep you up-to-

date with your child's time in school. If you struggle with accessing the app and/or site, please contact Mrs Curry. Once logged in, you will get daily updates of your child's behaviour record in school. Staff will be adding comments to explain why both S3/4 sanctions and P3/4 positives have been given. We will not be adding comments



for S1/2 or P1/2 records but think that this is a valuable addition to our home-school communication in that you can keep track of lower-level behaviour instances and hopefully discuss these occurrences at home to instil a change. We have now also sent home the **pupil log-in details** so that the children can check their own records. If possible, please encourage them to log in.

Class Charts also has a **homework** feature which we have now asked teachers to begin using to record homework tasks. This will allow you as parents to see what needs to be completed and when. Pupils will still record their homework in their planners to develop their own personal organisation skills.

A focus on... Reading



In our weekly update, I will be asking Curriculum Leaders to shine a spotlight on certain subject areas. We are starting with reading – a key focus of our 'back to school' approach. HMS is very much a school with reading at its heart – pupils here love reading and it is widely celebrated. All pupils are asked to have a reading book with them each day and form classes enjoy a session where their tutor will read a class novel to them.

At Hexham Middle School, our approach to reading is designed to promote and encourage a lifelong enjoyment and love of literature; create curious, independent and perceptive thinkers and create treasured memories of reading that pupils can cherish for many years to come.

Over lockdown, our English team and Mrs. Jackson, our dedicated librarian, have been working hard to make the library a resource which can better support students to choose the most appropriate reading materials for them as individuals. We have created a colour-coded system that allows pupils to select books suitable for their own reading ability and encourages them to track their own progress as they take on the challenge of moving up through the colour bands. Although our library has had to operate on revised opening times for different year groups, we are working hard to ensure that all students are able to access this valuable resource. A message from Mr Gaines regarding PE



It has been great to be outside and to get active in our PE lessons since normal lessons have restarted. Mr Gaines would like to give some PE messages:

- 1. Please bring the appropriate footwear for the activity. Boots or trainers with a good grip are essential for the lessons you are on the field.
- 2. Tracksuit bottoms are not part of the PE kit at HMS. Pupils can wear black shorts or black lycra style leggings as identified in the school planner.
- 3. For safety reasons, earrings cannot be worn for PE, extra-curricular clubs or competitive fixtures. Ears recently pierced should be taped for lessons. It would be helpful if your child brought their own tape with them.
- 4. Try to bring a plastic bag for wet shoes and clothing.
- 5. Pupils **do** need to change back into uniform to go home at the end of the day. This includes changing into their school shoes.
- **6.** A polite reminder that we do require a note if your child has an illness or injury. However, we will still ask your child to participate and learn in that lesson as either a coach, referee or another support role.
