Face coverings update

The Government has updated the COVID-19 guidance for schools. From **17 May**, the below changes around the use of face coverings will come into effect. The guidance states:

Based on the current state of the pandemic and the positive progress being made, it is no longer necessary to recommend the additional precautionary face covering measures put in place from the 8 March. From 17 May, in line with Step 3 of the roadmap, face coverings will no longer be recommended for pupils in classrooms or communal areas in all schools.

- Face coverings will also **no longer** be recommended for staff in classrooms.
- In all schools, we **continue** to recommend that face coverings should be worn by staff and visitors in situations outside of classrooms where social distancing is not possible (for example, when moving around in corridors and communal areas).
- Pupils should continue to wear face coverings on both school and public transport unless exempt.

It is important to note that if pupils would prefer to wear face coverings, they can continue to do so.
