## Update on life in school

Another week has once again flown by! We have had a busy couple of weeks in school with lots of curriculum enrichment activities including theatre visits, drama workshops, a visit from Dilston Physic Garden, author visits, Dan the Skipping Man, British Science Week and many more activities. Our teachers always go the extra mile to plan such varied learning opportunities for our pupils. I hope the children have enjoyed the many events and have discussed these with you at home.

A huge thank you to our PTA who have led this week's 'Mothers and Others Pop Up Shop'. It was brilliant to see the pupils getting involved, browsing and buying lots of lovely gifts for special loved ones in their lives. Thank you for all of your support in sending lots of items into school. The PTA have also confirmed two discos (one for KS2 and one for KS3) on Tuesday 29 and Wednesday 30 March. Letters have been sent home and tickets can be purchased by returning the consent form and payment to your child's form tutor. We hope that lots of pupils get involved and come along for a dance!

We are so excited to announce that author, Vashti Hardy, will be visiting pupils in Years 5 and 6 on Wednesday 30 March – we are so looking forward to welcoming Vashti to our school. Huge thanks to Mrs Hayler who always looks for new opportunities to celebrate reading at HMS, and to our brilliant PTA and The Hexham Book Festival for their generous funding.

## Arrival and departure: updates

You are probably now aware that Phase 2 of our new build is well underway with the demolition of the old QEHS lower school building in recent weeks. This area



will soon become our new coach park and rugby pitch. Access footpaths including a new route to the middle school will also soon be open for use. We are currently working with the contractors to review signage and line marking options in our car park which will be completed soon. Whilst we await this work being finalised, we ask for your support in enabling us to maintain pupil safety at arrival and departure times.

Arrival:

• We ask that you avoid vehicle movement in the immediate vicinity of the school as much as possible. This helps to reduce traffic on the surrounding streets where pupils are walking to the school site.

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- If you do need to drop your child at school (in the car park), please drive safely and slowly (10mph speed limit) in the school car park.
- Please drive straight to the top of the car park, drop your child off at the walkway (not down the car park, please) and then follow the loop around the car park to allow the smooth flow of traffic.
- When leaving the car park, it would help us if you could **turn left** (allowing our pupils to cross the road safely under the guidance of staff).

## Departure:

Due to an increased volume of traffic at the end of the day, we are asking for your support in limiting pick ups on the school site, where possible. We need the car park to be stationary to allow our pupils to safely find their bus/ taxi and to move around the car park without moving vehicles.

- If you collect your child, please make alternative arrangements to meet them off the school site. For the time being, we will no longer allow collection in the car park.
- If you are visiting the school during the day, please note that you will be unable to leave the car park after 3.00pm when the buses park up. Please either park off site or in the lower bays of the car park and/or be prepared to wait until the school transport leaves at 3.30pm.

We will review all of these arrangements when the coach park opens and will communicate updated procedures in due course. I thank you for your understanding and support.
