The Key Stage 2 HMS team did particularly well in winning a round against a much older team, as did two of the high school teams who qualified for the next round, which is expected to take place early in the New Year. Very well done to all involved. P Points have been allocated with special recognition for the Skills Builder skill of 'Aiming High'.

- When pupils attend a club, a member of staff will record attendance on Class Charts. Each recorded mark means a pupil gains an extra-curricular P Point that they can cash in for different events throughout the year.
- As a bonus, pupils achieving Bronze, Silver, Gold or Platinum extra-curricular awards will be able to attend a special celebration event at the end of the academic year.
