Update on life in school

Time has flown by once again this week, and it has been lovely to get out and about around school and in classrooms. It has been wonderful to see such a positive atmosphere in lessons and to see such brilliant attitudes to learning. At HMS, we place emphasis on showing pride in our work and striving for the highest standards in presentation and handwriting. Over the next few weeks, teachers will be nominating pupils for 'Head of School Awards' to recognise their efforts and there will be a special gathering of nominated pupils before the half term.

Reading

The more children read, the more confident they become across the curriculum in every subject.

It is hugely important that all children (in every year group) read every day. Please can you support us by working with your child to build positive reading routines. Children should read (either on their

own or with an adult) every day for at least 15-minutes. In KS2, children should update their reading records (in their planner).

All children visit our amazing library on a weekly basis where they are supported to choose a wide range of genres and have access to a wonderful range of non-fiction and poetry texts. You can also find the list of <u>'HMS Must Reads'</u> for each year group here and in your child's planner (all texts are available to our pupils in the HMS Library.

Spelling

We would really appreciate your support to encourage pupils to practice their spellings at home.

The statutory spelling lists (words the children must be able to spell) is available <u>here</u>. It would be very helpful if Year 5 and 6 pupils can be engaging with these words on a regular basis – we include words from the list in our weekly homework.

School Uniform Recycling

At HMS, we have a 'School Uniform Recycling' service which has been hugely popular. If you would like to request any recycled school uniform, you can request items here. To support the work of the HMS PTA, there is a suggested completely optional donation of £1 per item which can be sent to the school office. This will never be checked or chased up.

To help us build our stocks, we are looking for your support. Please could you send any branded items i.e. HMS school jumpers, polo shirts, PE hoodies and t-shirts to the HMS Office.

We are now also taking donations of warm coats which can be requested. Please send any winter coats you no longer need to the HMS Office and we will be able to re-use them.

Year 6 SATs Information Evening

Our 'Year 6 SATS Information Evening' takes place next Tuesday, the 31 January, at 6.30pm in the HMS Hall. If you would like to attend, please confirm how many seats you will require on this <u>form</u>. Children may attend this event if they wish, although they will get lots of information in school as we move towards the assessment period in May. The evening will have helpful information about what the assessments are like, when they are taken and how you find out about your child's results. There will also be information on how we help the children with their learning and ways you can further support your child's learning at home.
