



### **Year 6 Technology**

In design technology, year 6 pupils have been developing their knowledge of structures, modelling skills and the ability to use different tools, equipment and materials. We have been exploring the career area of landscape design as well as the concepts of sustainability. At present, our year 6 pupils have the design challenge to come up with a masterplan for our school grounds. We are looking forward to seeing some of the brilliant ideas that pupils have. It was amazing to see how one pupil, Evie, took her technology learning one step further and developed a new model for a playground structure using a range of different materials. Well done, Evie, for showing two of our school values - Engage and Aspire. Evie's



model is now on display at the front of the school. It just shows what, with a little bit of determination, we can achieve. Our current Skills Builder skill this half term is **creativity** - Evie's model is a testament

to this.
