Uniform should be worn appropriately in regard to both the policy and the judgement of the pastoral and senior staff.

### Safety in PE

The PE Department strongly recommends that pupils use appropriate safety equipment when taking part in activities at school. This includes the use of gum shields in rugby and hockey and shin pads in football and hockey. This advice is not mandatory but is strongly recommended. Parents/carers should ensure that their child brings the correct PE equipment to every lesson. In line with basic health and safety guidelines for sport and physical activity, all hair must be tied back and all jewellery, including ear studs, must be removed for pupils to participate within PE and extracurricular activity.
