

On 9 May, the NHS issued an urgent drug recall for the Emerade brand of adrenaline pens. Healthcare professionals should now be informing patients, or carers of patients, who carry Emerade 300 or 500 microgram auto-injector pens to obtain a prescription for and be supplied with an alternative brand.
