#### Le Grande Weekend – what an adventure!

The four-year wait came to an end on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> June as 56 pupils and 7 members of staff embarked on their journey to France.

## **Friday**

After arriving at the ferry port early on Friday morning, pupils were eager to get on the ferry and continue their journey across to France. During the 6-hour ferry crossing pupils were able to explore and enjoy the vast array of entertainment options including arcade games and cinema screenings. The long journey was worth it when we arrived at the château — what an amazing place! For the evening entertainment, pupils enjoyed working in teams to protect their eggs (laid by the resident chickens).



## **Saturday**

On Saturday morning, we visited the hypermarket and traditional French market. Pupils enjoyed walking around the market looking at all the different stalls. Mr Armstrong was very impressed with all pupils' efforts to try and speak in French. The crêpes stall proved to be the most popular and pupils enjoyed a variety of crêpes. Pupils enjoyed an afternoon of activities at the château (including Zip wire, fencing, climbing and nightline). Saturday evening saw the highly anticipated French-themed evening. Pupils were able to try frogs legs (les cuisses de grenouilles) and snails (les escargots) as well as test their knowledge of France in a French quiz.

# **Sunday**

On Sunday morning, we visited one of the most medieval castles in Europe. Pupils learnt about the history behind the 'Château de Fougères' and were given a tour by our fantastic group leader 'Louis'. On Sunday afternoon, we made our way to the magical 'Mont Saint Michel', on arrival pupils were in awe. After making our way to the top and visiting the abbey, pupils were given some time to explore 'Diagon Alley', where they enjoyed some retail therapy. Ice cream was the order of the day. On return to the château, pupils enjoyed an outdoor disco.

#### **Monday**

On our way back to the UK, we visited the Bayeux Tapestry and watched an awe-inspiring film telling the story of 'The 100 days of the Battle of Normandy'. Mr Johnson was so impressed with how sensitive pupils were and their level of engagement. After another journey on the ferry, there was a late-night trip to McDonalds, which was well received by pupils and staff alike.

#### Year 6 residential

What an amazing time KS2 had on their residential trips to Whithaugh! I was lucky enough to go with both the Y5 and the Y6 group and, as ever, I was so proud of our pupils' positive attitudes, exceptional behaviour and incredible determination. The weather was kind to us so the pupils were able to fully enjoy jumping in the lake after kayaking and canoeing; switching positions on rafts that they had built themselves; taking in the stunning views from the zipwire; building dens during bushcraft and so many other fantastic activities. I was particularly impressed to see so many Y5s reaching the top of the outdoor climbing wall and so many Y6s taking the high ropes leap of faith in their stride. The centre staff commented on how polite and engaged the children were throughout their stay and it



was wonderful for us to see lots of new friendships being built. Although we won't be returning to Whithaugh next year, we have two new and exciting trips for Year 5 and 6 in the pipeline, watch this space...
