An update on life in school

It's been a busy week looking ahead to September. We were delighted to welcome our new Year 5 cohort to spend the day with us on Tuesday. Pupils joined their new form classes, met their teacher and spent a day settling in and getting to know each other. The children also enjoyed a PE lesson and a visit to our Fellside Forest School. It was great to welcome parents/carers on the evening and to see the children so excited to show off their new classroom and school.

Year 8 also had a great day over at QEHS (or their chosen high school) and we have been hearing all about it as they returned to HMS yesterday. Year 8 have a busy few weeks ahead with their end of year trip, Leavers' Party, Leavers' Assembly and other special events to celebrate their time at HMS.

We have our annual End of Year Trips coming up – please can you double check that you have completed the consent forms. The next couple of weeks are as action-packed as ever – the schedule is included at the end of this week's update for you.

Food Technology... an update!

We really value food technology as part of our curriculum, and our pupils have produced a wide range of dishes this year. Next year, we would like to build on our curriculum experience by introducing an even broader range of skills and a greater level of complexity.

We know that providing ingredients can be costly and stressful for parents/carers. As a school, we have made the decision that **we will provide pupils with the necessary ingredients** for each food technology practical session. We believe that this approach will save time for parents/carers, reduce costs, limit waste and eliminate any risks involved with transporting ingredients between home and school.

- From September 2023, ingredients will be provided in school for all pupils in all year groups.
- In September, we will ask for a one-off voluntary contribution from parents to support this plan (between £15 and £20 per year).
- The pupils will need to provide a suitable, secure container to take their food home in.
- If your child has specific allergies or dietary requirements, you may wish to provide them with their own ingredients from home. Please let us know via <u>admin@hexhammiddle.org.uk</u>.
- If your child would like to add extras to the recipes, this will be discussed with the food technology teacher during lessons.
