#### Spotlight on Careers... Miss Lamont

I grew up in Rothbury and attended school in Morpeth – which was a school very similar to QEHS, so it has been lovely to come and work as part of a Trust that strikes a familiar chord. I attended the Sixth Form College at my high school, studying biology, maths, history, and chemistry. After school, I attended University of Leicester, studying Biological Sciences. This course was ideal for me as it had a broad scope of modules, which allowed me to focus on topics I was really interested in! These included biochemistry, neuroscience, and physiology.



From fifteen onwards, I had always had part-time jobs, and I continued with this at university. My favourite was working at Starbucks – partially for the chats with customers, and partially for the unlimited free coffee, an addiction that I have not quite managed to shake since becoming a teacher!

When I finished my course, I really was not sure what I wanted to do – I wanted a profession that was science based, but I had no idea what! I tried some research work experience at the Newcastle University laboratories, but it was not for me, so I saved up and went travelling! Some of my travels included marine conservation, and part of this was teaching children on a Malay Island about preserving their environment – I think this is where the teaching bug started!

When I got back from travelling, I started working at Boots as a trainee pharmacy advisor while I applied to do my PGCE in Secondary Science. Through this course I trained at two very different schools, which brought varied challenges, but I loved it. I knew I wanted to return to Northumberland to teach, as I loved the three-tier school system myself and was very lucky to be accepted to work at Hexham Middle School. I am now starting my third year of teaching and have also just started doing my master's degree in education – so I have busy year in store!
