

#### **Great Attendance**

This week we have received a letter from Chris Witty, Chief Medical Officer for England, who has written to schools to discuss attendance concerns which have become more prevalent since the COVID pandemic which resulted in most children being asked to stay at home. Although our average attendance is above local and national levels, we have still not fully returned to pre-pandemic levels of attendance within our school community. As always, we want to work closely with families and children where attendance is a cause for concern in order to help each pupil to achieve their potential. Please contact Steve Hodgson (HMS Attendance Officer) or your child's Head of Key Stage if there are any issues which impact your child's attendance. Each day's absence results in at least five missed lessons - this is a significant amount of learning time. A pupil who has 90% attendance will miss over one hundred lessons in an academic year and miss out on the many opportunities afforded to them at Hexham Middle School. We thank you for your continued support.
