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Where can languages take you? – Year 8 Careers

Where can languages take you?

On Monday, our year 8 pupils took part in a careers webinar organised by the British Council called 'Where can languages take you?'. Pupils have been finding out about how learning a language can support them in the future. During the webinar, guest speakers spoke about their experiences with languages and how languages have helped them develop essential skills for the world of work. Pupils heard from employees of GCHQ, Homes England and a student from Durham University who wants to be a translator. All of the speakers spoke about the opportunities to

travel that learning a language gave them. In their language lessons, pupils will complete a follow up activity to further their understanding and knowledge on languages and careers.

Futbol Lingo Event at Northumbria University



On Tuesday 12th March, some year 8 pupils had the opportunity to take part in a football, languages and careers workshop. Pupils were given a motivational talk about how languages can be beneficial in the world of work. Pupils had the chance to design a bid to host the Copa America as well as learn some useful Spanish words during their football practical session. Pupils also had the chance to do some paper-cutting artwork. Overall, the sessions stimulated interest and understanding of Chinese culture and enabled the pupils to embrace cultural diversity.

Together, they had built and programmed two Lego robots to travel through a maze and solve various puzzles. Judges were particularly impressed with their creative forklift design that could operate levers.
