# **RSE Update - Summer Term**

During the summer term, pupils will have the opportunity to explore elements of the statutory relationship curriculum across both Key Stage 2 and 3, as well sex education for your year 7 and 8 pupils. Finally, we've explored the origins of coins, why they are important and what they can tell us about a society (even our own!) as well as designing our own coins.
