Smartphone Free Childhoods - Arrangements for September 2025

Pupils in years 5 and 6:	Pupils in years 7 and 8:
 Our expectation is that pupils in these year groups will <u>not</u> be given access to a smartphone by their parents. Instead, parents may choose to provide a nonsmart 'brick' phone (and/or tracking device) as desired. Non-smart 'brick' phones will be allowed to be brought to school and individual schools will clarify their own policy on these, e.g. if they are to be handed in each day or kept in bags, etc. Smartphones will be <u>banned</u> in school for pupils in years 5 and 6, i.e. they should not be brought to school at all. 	 We accept that many pupils moving into years 7 and 8 in September 2025 will already have a smartphone. For these year groups, we will continue our policy on mobile phones that has applied up until now, i.e. that they can be brought to school but must be switched off and kept out of sight throughout the school day. From September 2026, the approach as it applies to years 5 and 6 will extend to year 7, and then to year 8 from September 2027. At that point we will

Hexham Bike Bus

Tynedale's cycling mayor and team are putting a call-out for adult cyclist volunteers to support a "Bike Bus" initiative in Hexham, scheduled to start in mid-September. A bike bus is a means of enabling young cyclists to move safely through streets as a supervised group, thus offering them greater protection from traffic than when riding alone.
