### Staffing update

Earlier this week, I shared an update with you on the temporary changes to our pastoral leadership structure. As you may be aware, Mr Rutherford-Orrock (Head of Key Stage 2) is currently absent, and Miss Bell (Deputy Head of Key Stage 2) has been covering the role. From Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> November, the below arrangements will be in place:

- Miss Bell will become the Head of Year 5
- Miss Lamont will become the Head of Year 8

Miss Bell and Miss Lamont will continue to deputise for Year 6 and Year 7 respectively. Miss Karn (Assistant Headteacher) continues to lead the whole team with overall responsibility for safeguarding, behaviour, attendance and pastoral care.

We all wish her every success for the future. I am delighted to say that Mr Morgan has been busy recruiting new staff this week and updates will follow including any amendments to 'Key Worker' allocation.
