
Non-uniform day – thank you!

Hexham Schools Smartphone Policy

With Christmas coming, we thought it would be helpful to send this reminder of school policy regarding smartphones. For **pupils in years 5 and 6**, the expectation is that they will <u>not</u> be given access to a smartphone by their parents until they are older. Instead, parents may choose to provide an <u>alternative</u>, e.g. a non-smart 'brick' phone (and/or tracking device) as desired. Non-smart 'brick' phones will be allowed to be brought to school provided they are kept switched off and out of sight during the school day, however smartphones are <u>banned</u> in school other than in exceptional circumstances. [Please note, smartwatches are deemed acceptable provided they have no internet connection or access to social media].

From September 2026, this approach will extend to year 7, and then to year 8 from September 2027. At that point we will take a view as to whether or not to extend the approach to high school year groups.
