## Pupil Support Update

This week, we have re-launched our new pupil support spaces across the school. These slight changes will allow us to further strengthen our pupil support offer. The new spaces are below – you may wish to discuss these changes with your child if you know they access the support hubs as part of their in-school provision:

### Recruitment to the Trust Board

The Board of Hadrian Learning Trust is looking to appoint a new trustee with a legal background. Beyond this specific professional requirement, the overriding requirement is to be committed to supporting the schools to be as good as they possibly can for the young people we serve, and willing to operate in a positive, supportive and constructively-challenging way with other trustees, school leaders and staff.

The Trust Board meets six times a year on Thursday evenings at 6pm with meetings usually lasting two hours. Much of the Board's work is undertaken by committees which meet three to four times a year, typically in the late afternoon. These committees include a monitoring committee for each school, an HR & Performance Management Committee and a Finance & Audit Committee. We also have a safeguarding group comprising a link trustee and senior leaders that meets three times a year. Trustees also visit the schools as part of their monitoring activities. Each trustee sits on at least one committee or group but this is not a condition of joining the Board. 
### For Parents - Family Gaming Database
